INTRODUCTION

The 18th season of this major competition the Champions league has the managers competing in it from the top 5 divisions in the Super20 leagues. With the Group stage and then two-legged knock out stage it is the competition that has the most matches for a manager to get through to the final, 18 matches are required to get through to this prestigious final

The history of this competition tells us that managers that make the final have used a lot of skill to get here and if not already a name in the FC World they are going to be from now on.

Today we see two debutants in the final and so once more we will have a new name on the trophy showing the depth of the FC World.

For both it also represents a chance of a first major trophy and to take their place amongst the legends of the game and become one of the very few managers in the history of Fantasy Challenge to have won a major trophy.

Owen Gredley who started his career in the FC World four consecutive promotions and was considered a rising star of the FC World shocked everyone when he dropped out of the game in 2015 only to return three years later. Amazingly once more claiming several promotions since his return and has secured promotion form League Two this season so he is once mor eon the radar as a manager to be taken seriously claiming a Major trophy will cement his place in the history books of the FC World.

Tracy joined the Fantasy Challenge the season that Owen dropped out and has been catching the eye ever since. Two consecutive promotions in her first two season and a 3rd place finish in the Overall League got the attention of all in the FC World after two season another two promotions were secured and this season promotion form League One into the Championship has been secured keeping her one division above Owen. Like Owen victory today will cement her name into the history books of the FC World.

After 18 matches it all boils down to this one gameweek which will take place on 1 day something that doesn't happen often during a normal season. This scenario always makes these finals interesting and of course there is the potential of a Penalty Shoot-Out which has never yet happened in a major final.

All will be revealed on Sunday 22nd May.

A difficult season is coming to an end and the chance of glory awaits both these managers let's hope it will be a final to remember.

This has been a short introduction and the FC Expert's analysis has also been cut down a bit but with the current time constraints it does get harder to keep producing fresh content for these final previews.

THE ANALYSIS

Due to time constraints, this is going to be a shortened version of what I normally do for a cup final.

When you look at the teams pictured on the previous page you think wow a 48 all draw it would have gone to a penalty Shoot-Out something that hasn't happened in a final. Then though you realise both managers made several transfer costing them points so in Gameweek 37 Owen Gredley would have come out on top 40-32. One thing does tell you is that both managers had an eye on this final surely making transfers in advance and shedding those transfer points early.

I am going to go through three categories that I think will decide this final.

Seven players the same in a squad of Fifteen represents virtually 50% of the two squads being the same. The we look at the players from different all defenders so clean sheets will be cancelled out you are looking at one of your defenders as opposed to your opponent grabbing a vital goal or assist. Looking at the squad you ar asking yourself where is the differential here?

Both managers got their Captain picks wrong which is unusual for two managers of such high calibre, more shocking was how many other players in their team scored higher and in fact both had a player on the bench who would have done better. What is very interesting is after assessing the two squads and seeing how many players they have that are the same that we got two completely different captain picks. Tracy will be looking and thinking that an incredible 7 players would have been better than her current pick whilst Owen will be left to reflect that he had 4 other players that would have been a better selection. That said with so much in the balance on the final day I can't see them straying away from their Tottenham players on the final day and for this final. Tottenham are away to already relegated Norwich needing a win to secure Champions League football surely, they are going to do this and in style where you would have to say Son and Kane looking the ideal candidate for captain. They might consider going left field and select their Chelsea players who are at home to Watford also relegated but Chelsea don't have anything to play for now and are also very inconsistent it could be a goal fest but it could easily be a drab low scoring win for Chelsea. Tracy has done well to hold onto a chip going into this final, it is going to give her a major advantage. Get that Captain pick right and surely the trophy is hers. So surely this final is going to come down to that Captain pick as we have just assessed the captain picks it looks like Tracy will be going for either Son or Kane. Now Son didn't perform for her in Gameweek 37 will she double down on the South Korean who is chasing the golden boot or go for England captain Kane. The big decision here is if Son does score, he gets extra as a midfielder but Kane could easily outscore Son. For Owen surely, he is going to try and pick the same captain to nullify those extra points or will he think I have to gamble on Son in the hope that Tracy goes for Kane and Son can get those extra midfield points. It is a game of poker, with us left to wonder who will blink first.

Both managers will need to take a look at the fixtures below of the final day of the season to try and figure out who will be really trying and whose season is over. The selection of captain could be vital to gaining success in this final.

THE VERDICT

Ordinarily you would be thinking about Liverpool in a Champions League and resting players but not on this occasion as they have to win to take the Premier League title there is so much happening on the last day the two managers have to try and find that sweet spot of a player with something to play for and chance of real points. As already suggested I can't see past Tottenham away to Norwich yes there are some potential left field choices but this fixture is the closest thing to a banker.

It is going to come down to that Captain pick with the two squads being so similar. Tracy has that Chip and having gone against a chip before already this season and being proven wrong I just can't see Owen combating that Chip.

That said I have a feeling that Owen is going to move away from the Tottenham players and pull something special out form his squad in the hope of finding that differential against the Chip, A big gamble but a selection of Manchester City's De Bruyne or Chelsea's James to try and combat those triple points.

FINAL VERDICT: - Tracy to get that Captain Pick right and Owen's left field choice to surprise us all and make it close but ultimately not enough. A Tracy Thompson victory.

IN THE EVENT OF A DRAW

In the event of a draw the match will go into a penalty Shoot-Out. A penalty shoot-out will take place, each team's top five-point scorers will go head-to-head to produce a result. If the best five scorers in the two teams cannot produce a result sudden death will take place with the next highest point scorers being next.
