Welcome to this seasons FC Cup Final preview.

This is the third season that the distinctive FC World red top banner will adorn the FC Cup final preview, great news was that the FC World was able to cover each round this season with featured matches giving this the oldest cup competition in the history of Fantasy Challenge the special treatment that it deserves.

We seem to say year on year that the Final produces a story and this year is no different. It has become increasingly difficult to not keep on mentioning the dramatic final of 2017 in which all manner of records were broken the highest ever scoring final and the first and only final so far to have gone to a replay.

Why are we mentioning it again this year well because the victorious manager in that final Omid Afzalalghom is back again in a record equalling third final, please see the last page of this preview for some other records broken in this seasons competition, in a quirk of fate like that final when Omid met Daniel Sherry who was in his rookie season once more Omid is meeting a manager in his rookie season Anthony Lobo.

With Omid having already equalled the record of most appearances in the final and is trying to become only the second ever manager in the history of Fantasy Challenge to win the FC Cup twice. Omid is already famous for being the only manager who has won the Champions League twice with 3 major trophies to his name he is recognised as one of the most successful managers in the history of the game.

Todays final might have a real feel of David versus goliath but Anthony Lobo has got to a major final in his rookie season which is a fantastic achievement and now just one match away from winning a major trophy he can also take his place in history to become one of only a handful of managers to have won a major trophy.

On two previous occasions has a manager been in the final trying to win the competition for a second time both times it has been Steve Shew, in 2007 'Shewy' was unsuccessful in his attempt to win a second FC Cup then in 2012 'Shewy' became the first manager to lift the trophy twice. Can Lobo take hope that currently no manager has been successful in their first attempt in a final to win the competition a second time.

In the last two seasons We have been treated to high scoring finals with the hundred mark being missed by just one point by last seasons winner David Noel the year before both managers hit hundred mark and Omid won the replay also scoring over a hundred. Those two finals though did have the help of extra fixtures this season although the Premier League has 4 clubs in the Semi-Finals of the two European competitions there are no extra fixtures so it will be a tough ask for the two managers to hit such a high score.

The FC Expert as always will be casting his eye over the two manager's perspective teams as always it will be interesting to see how he/she sees the final finishing and we will all get a great insight into the two teams finding what transfer and chop options they both have.

I hope you enjoy this preview of the FC Cup final, all that is left to do is wish both Managers the best of luck in this final.

Lobo is in his rookie season and is having a mixed bag so far only moving out of the relegation zone in Pyramid Two in gameweek 36, with a good 82-46 victory over Ryan Hill who was is chasing promotion. He is sitting in a precarious position with just two matches to go just a single point above the relegation zone. Victory in this final and surviving relegation would be a great end to the season and will have many in the FC World looking to see what he will do in his second season.

His run to the final has been an interesting one and has been in stark contrast to his form in Pyramid Two. He has only really had one tight encounter which happened in the First Round taking on a fellow Pyramid Two manager Jean Joden, Lobo coming through by just two points winning 50-48.

In the Second Round Lobo dispatched Raymond Turp of League One 95-46 that second victory was followed up in the Third Round with a 63-39 win over Joe Rudd also in his rookie season currently managing in Pyramid Three.

Then Matt Earley of Pyramid One was beaten 77-68, Matt is now managing in Pyramid One after being promoted last season and finished in the top of the overall League last season.

Going into the Quarter-Final Lobo was struggling in Pyramid Two lying in 16th two points from safety, in contrast his opponent League One manager Tony Collins was in 6th place a point from promotion. Collins is a big name in the FC World with several promotions to his name but is most famous for winning the Champions League in 2016 then making the final a season later in 2017 only to lose by 7 points. Lobo though showed that whilst he is struggling Pyramid Two showed no respect of reputation as he won 48-35.

Showing his credentials for this final in the Semi-Final Lobo beat Premiere League manager Gen Hogwood with relative ease 88-46. Hogwood is struggling with his own fight in the Premier League but this victory has extra significance due to Hogwoods great FC Cup having been a former winner. Read the last page of this profile to see what FC Cup record Hogwood broke this season.

Omid is one of the most famous managers in the FC World having won 3 major trophies he was also famous for being and ever-present Premier league manager and having finished in the top 8 every season to qualify for the Super20 cup each season. That was until last season when he was finally relegated from the Premier League all wondered what would happen to Omid as many top Premier league managers have dropped down the leagues after being relegated. It would seem not so for Omid as of course he re asserts himself at the top of the game with this record equalling third appearance in the FC Cup final and is looking good for an immediate return to the Premier League lying 3rd in the Championship although it is tight just 3 points clear of 6th.

The Cup run has been relatively simple for Omid. Andy Polloway of Pyramid Two was despatched 61-51 in the 1st Round. Stephen Overy of the Conference was then beaten 57-43 in the Second Round.

The Third Round was to be Omid's toughest match coming through by just 3 points beating Dee Patel of League One 63 – 60.

The 4th Round saw Omid hit over a hundred points in a 106-47 victory over Paren Arzoomanian of Pyramid Premier.

IN the Quarter-Final Omid despatched the former Champions League finalist Andy Hilliard who is in his comeback season after being out of the game for 3 seasons dropping out after being relegated from the Premier League in 2015. Omid coming out on top 49-36.

In the Semi-Final Omid toppled Martin Stuart of Pyramid Premier with a margin of 18 points winning 97-71.

for transfers, that 100 points saw Stuart move from 118th in gameweek 9 to 74th a rise of 44 places to avoid the Qualifying Round.

PRENDERGAST WILDCARD POWERS THROUGH

Daragh Prendergast the FC Cup Runner-Up in 2016 gambled on playing his wildcard to come from the lowest position of the managers to Qualify for the First Round. Prendergast was placed 120th in Gameweek 9 he moved up 37 places to 83rd claiming the last spot in the First Round. The Wildcard paid dividends scoring a massive 91 points helped by selecting Salah as captain contributing 30 points.

HANSELL CLIMBS 34 PLACES

Dave Hansell team hit a massive 97 points to fire him into the First Round. Hansell started the gamewek 6 places from the First Round and 5 points off qualification but those 97 points saw Hansell climb 34 places from 89th to 55th. He had five players hitting double figures, his captain Salah (30), Goalkeeper Ryan (10), Alonso (11) and Bournemouth duo Fraser (11) and Callum Wilson (13).

Paren Arzoomanian made Chelsea's Eden Hazard captain but when he didn't play Arsenal's Pierre-Emerik Aubameyang stood in. Aubameyang scored against Crystal Palace and hit 16 points as captain. That score helped

Arzoomanian to 92 points taking him from 106th place to 75th avoiding the Qualifying Round.

arman Bansai qualified for the first round by moving from 85th two places off qualification to 57th hitting 92 points. Karman played his free-Hit to see hi push over the line for qualification. Once more Liverpool's Salah led the way as captain with 30 points, weighing in was Chelsea's Alonso (11), Mane Liverpool (15) and Bournemouth's Callum Wilson scoring 13.

oe Higgins hit 94 points moving up 30 places in the league to 58th to qualify for the First Round. Higgins was another manager gaining an advantage of Liverpool's Salah returning to form making him captain and getting a 30 point reward.

anji Joshi hit 88 points making his move from 96th place to 72nd. Joshi like the other managers that came through to qualify for the First Round can take credit for his captain pick, Joshi's captain hitting 30 points but his captain was Liverpool's Saido Mane.

att Hansell managed to move into the First Round with a core of 78 climbing 12 places from 90th to 78th. Hansell yet another manager benefitting from Mo Slaah's contribution as captain with 30 points.

RYAN PERRETT FEELS THE HAZARD

Ryan Perrett fell 33 places falling from 69th to 102nd. Ryan had gone with a captain selection of Chelsea's Eden Hazard but Hazard did not take to the field the captaincy went to Manchester City's Segio Aguero who only managed 2 points doubling to 4 in a gameweek where most managers had Liverpool's Mane or Salah who were scoring 30 points as captain it this return was not enough especially as his team only scored 34 points with Manchester United's Pogba and Bournemouth's Brooks both top scoring with 8 points.

HILL FALLS OUT

Ryan Hill was in 82nd after Gamweek 9 just one place above the drop out zone for the Qualifying Round. Hill had selected Chelsea's Eden Hazard as captain but injury meant he didn't play Vice captain Arsenal's Pierre-Emerik Aubayeng had to step up he scored against Crystal Palace and gave Ryans team 16 points but the overall score of 59 was not enough to get Ryan through.

teve Whitely went into gameweek 10 in 71st place 12 points clear of 83rd. Whitely gambled with 3 transfers to try and claim a place in the First Round losing 4 points before a ball was kicked in the Gameweek. He placed his trust in Liverpool defender Robertson with the captaincy as Liverpool were at home to Cardiff but Robertson was rested although a Cardiff goal would not have seen clean sheet points gained. The armband transferred to Leicester City's Jamie Vardy who could only secure 2 points as he only played 45 minutes. All that meant Whitely dropped 19 places and missed out on the First Round by 10 points.

An Wyatt was 72nd going into Gamewek 10 with a 10 point cushion above 83rd. Wyatt scored 46 points with 7 points coming off his bench as Richarlison (Everton) scoring 5 coming on for Hazard (Chelsea) and Jonny (Wolves) 2 points on for Pereira (Cardiff). Once again though another manager missing out had got his captain wrong with Arsenal's Lacazette only scoring 4 points this was just not enough as Wyatt slipped to 92nd in the League and into the Qualifying Round.

Ichard Munroe started in 74th place but would finish the gameweek in 98th dropping 24 places. Munroe will be another manager left reflecting on his captain pick as his team scored 42 points missing out by 17 points he had Aguero scoring 4 points he had Mane in midfield who hit 15 points which could have given Munroe an extra 13 points if he had been captain although it would have not been enough, Arnautovic not playing and not making any transfers proving costly alongside that decision on who to give the armband.

att Coe was in 77th place just 5 points clear of 83rd and in with a chance of the First Round. Coe didn't gamble with any transfers and watches his team score 37 points but three of his starting 11 didn't play, Crystal Palace's Tomkins came off the bench to score a point, another Palace player Zaha also coming off the bench hitting 5 points. The last substitute though form Burnley Tarkowski scoring -1 cancelling out Tomkins point. Aguero as captain only hit 4 points it was just not enough as Coe plummeted 31 places to 108th and now faces the Qualifying Round.

Im Burrows started the gameweek in the precarious position of 83rd the last place to avoid the Qualifying Round only above Onder Cebi and Karman Bansi on transfer countback. Burrows team hit 58 points which was not enough missing out by 15 points. If he had gone with Bournemouth's Wilson instead of Aguero as captain he could have added 9 points to that total, If he had put Manchester City's keeper Ederson in goal he would have gained another 6 points which would have seen his place in the overall table come down to transfer countback again. If you take a further look at Burrows bench if he had picked Southampton's Cedric ahead of Arsenal's Bellerin or Liverpool's Alexander-Arnold, Cedrics 7 points would have seen Burrows through into the First Round.

Hogwood had both of Laws players and David Silva also of City. Silva relieved the pressure on Hogwood scoring the opening goal for City and bagging 5 points. Then Aguero scored bringing Law 4 more points as his captain pick. No more goals or assists the tie was tenderly poised with Hogwood 2 points in the lead 50-48. Both managers







Omid Afzalalghom is one of the biggest names in FC World history he is a multiple major trophy winner with 3 major trophies to his name he is the only manager to have won the Champions League twice and won the FC Cup in 2017. Omid was also famous for being the only manager to have qualified for the Super20 cup every season until last season when he was relegated form the Premier league after being an ever present. He is currently lying 7th in the Championship 3 points for promotion and has qualified for the New Life Cup, many in the Fc World though believe Omid's main goal this season is to get back into the Primer at the first attempt. 

Stuart is having a decent season in the Pyramid Premier lying in 9th place 9 points off the promotion places. Stuart like Afzalalghom is also in the New Life Cup in the Quarter-Finals. For Afzalalghom the Semi-Final represents the chance of making more history for Stuart the opportunity to win a first major trophy.

Martin Stuart though did make 3 transfers losing 8 points before a ball had been kicked in the Gameweek. After Friday's evening match Omid had gone a further 2 points clear as his 3 Liverpool players scored 11 points Martin Stuart also had 3 Liverpool players but they could only score 9 points which got Stuart back into the positive but 10 points behind in

the tie. Then to the Saturday 3pm kick-offs where both managers would add a significantly to their totals. Omid's Leicester and Burnley players grabbed this tie to take control. Leicester's Jamie Vardy hit 16 points whilst Burnley's Ashley Westwood scored 13 points. Leicester City's Portuguese defender Ricardo Pereira also adding 6 points. Omid also had Bournemouth duo David Brooks and Callum Wilson who added 4 points a

Stuart was then relying on his West Ham keeper Lukasz Fabianksi in the final fixture of the gameweek and in the penultimate match Arsenal's French forward Alexandre Lacazette. Arsenals capitulation at Everton seemingly was another nail in the coffin for Stuart in this semi-final Lacazatte only grabbing 2 points whilst Omid's Everton and England number 1 Jordan Pickford picking up a vital 7 points to increase Omid's lead to 28 points. For Stuart in now needed an amazing performance from Fabianslki a clean sheet, penalty save, bonus points and maybe an assist, it wasn't to be as Eden Hazard bagged two goal one great mazy dribble through the west Ham defence securing Omid's passage into the Final.

After the first fixture of the gameweek on a Friday evening Hogwood took an early lead going 12 points clear with his captain Liverpool's Mo Salah bagging a creditable 12 points. With both managers having 3 players playing it was first blood to Hogwood. Then the Saturday 3pm kick-offs took place. Lobo's sat back and watched the points flow in from his free hit. His Crystal Palace goalkeeper Vicente Guaita scoring 10 points, then the Leicester City's trio piled on the points. Portuguese defender Ricardo Pereira adding 6 points, Midfielder James Maddison 7 points then captain Jamie Vardy adding a fantastic 32 points cancelling out Hogwoods captain Mo Salah's 12 from the previous evening. Those 4 players scoring an amazing 55 points Lobo was now 36 points in the lead in the tie. With just two fixtures to go both managers captains had played. Lobo had 4 players to play whilst Hogwood had 6. In the penultimate fixture Hogwoods players managed to reduce the deficit by 3 points but none of his 3 players had hit a high score. 



Why is so obvious you ask? Neither manager made a transfer with both having used their wildcards and free-hit both chose to give themselves the maximum transfers for this final which will be two for both. With Anthon Lobo embroiled in a relegation battles in Pyramid Two and Omid Afzalalghom is fighting to gain promotion from the Championship back to the Premier league at the first attempt tells everyone how important this FC Cup final is to both managers.

As in recent season the Chip sare going to be vital factor in this final but I will com onto that later, last season I changed the format of the Match Analysis and this season I have decided to tweak it once more.

So onto the two teams which in gameweek 36 would have seen Omid Afzalalghom come out a winner by 10 points in a high scoring game 92-82.

DEFENCE

Also, on his bench was Southampton's Valery who would have contributed 2 more points than Doherty.

Different formations being used with Lobo having the extra defender but he was only employed as an automatic substitution in Gameweek 36 his defence still scored 1 less point. Both have one of the star defenders of the season Liverpool's Alexander-Arnold. Although different players they both have representatives for title chasing Manchester City and Wolverhampton wanderers one of the teams of the season. Omid came out on to even though he hadn't selected the correct defence Lobo got his selections spot on. Omid gas two Southampton defender son his bench in Yoshida and Valery they visit West Ham a team that is difficult to judge what you will get form one week to the next. Lobo had Burnley's Tarkowski with them playing Manchester City in gameweke 36 was the correct decision but for the final Burnley are away to Everton both teams hitting a bit of form recently.

Lobo will be trying to get what information he can from Manchester City about De Bruyne we all know how effective he can be which is why Lobo had selected him but a muscle injury ruled him out an currently no return date is a worry for Lobo.

Afzalalghom selection of 3 forwards and as already mentioned not the top line forwards look to be inspire din Gameweek 36, Afzalalghom will just be hoping that his forward line have not peaked to soon. Had this final been played in Gameweek 36 was where the final would be decided Omid getting his forward line selection spot on whilst Lobo had the correct selections in his squad but not tha captain pick.

De Bruyne valued at £9.6 gives him some money in the market but Crouch is a budget player at £4.4. Lobo's challenge is to find the gem to replace Crouch. Afzalalghom has decent budget he has managed to increase his budget y £3.8 over the season. He only has one injury worry Southampton's Yoshida. Personally, I think he will have to look at his Tottenham players they both let him down in Gameweek 36 and after seeing their first leg loss to Ajax they are still in and you have to think that they will be trying to leave something in the tank for an almighty push in the Johan Cruyff Arena. That said I think Omid can look at Lobo's team and think about neutralising some o fo his big hitters Salah and Aguero being the main examples.

FC Expert Match Analysis

THE VERDICT

BORING BORING FC EXPERT – I hear chant at the screen as you read this. Ye syou guessed it once again I am going to mention options which manager in this final has the better options.

As we saw in Gameweek 36 a manager has many decisions to make not just his players but formation transfers and whether you play those chips. In Gameweek 36 whilst Lobo got most of his decisions correct, he lost whilst Afzalalghom hadn't got most of his decisions right he came out on top in Gameweek 36.

To the options Lobo has that Chip which is a massive option and should give him 4 extra players in the final. Strangely though the option of the bench boost reduces his options in the transfer market he must transfer out De Bruyne and Crouch. Crouch being such a budget player valued at £4.4 it doesn't give Lobo much money to play with. He must make sure he gets players in that will play. For Omid his options are all about the two transfers he has does he try and bring in a Salah or Aguero to cancel out Lobo's big hitters or go down a different path to try and cancel out that Bench Boost.

Looking at the fixtures and those transfers for Lobo I owul dbe interested in options form Manchester United away to Huddersfield surely United are going to try and end the season well and give it all they have in the race for the Champions League places. A real gamble could be Pogba for De Bruyne this would give a little extra cash for the replacement of Crouch he is then scratching around in the bargain basement of forwards. An Ashley Barnes of Burnley, Calvert-Lewin at Everton Ings at Southampton or Shane Long also of Southampton who has managed to find the net recently. What Lobo must do is make sure who he brings in plays all going well if they do nothing those 4 players should be bring in a minimum of 8 points into his team.

For Afzalalghom as mentioned before will he be tempted to cancel out Lobo's Salah or Aguero. I think he should not be attracted to getting in Salah as he has Mane which should virtually cancel out Salah. Aguero is an interesting one especially after how well his front three performed in Gameweke 36. Wilson Bournemouth at home to Tottenham a difficult one to predict Tottenham need the points but surely, they must be concentrating on the Champions League Semi-Final. Leicester's Jamie Vardy is away to Manchester City, Leicester have a great record against City in recent season and Lobo has City's Ederson in goal if Leicester score you would have to fancy it would Vardy and that would also take away points from Lobo. Last option is Wolves Jimenez Lobo has as him as well I do not see Lobo being able to change Jimenez so for I suggest Omid leaves this alone. I think he needs to look at his two Tottenham Midfielders which also gives him a decent budget. With Manchester United away to Huddersfield who are shipping in goals I think some options there will be of interest will he think Lobo will go for Pogba so I can cancel that out. With the budget he has he could easily bring in a Bernado Silva or Leroy Sane of Manchester City but although at home Leicester does look like a tough fixture but City are also capable of hitting a four or five if they catch fire. An interesting gamble could be to look at Arsenal who have been appalling recently but Brighton could take the field knowing they have survived if Cardiff don't get something at home to Crystal Palace would the Brighton players relax and Arsenal suddenly find their home form again or could the Europa league become a factor. For Omid in strange way although he has more options for his transfers than Lobo to me there are also more questions then answers. Lobo might not have the options but by a quirk of fate his transfers are potentially simpler.

The other big decision for both managers is those captain picks it is a credit to both managers I think they have good options. As we saw in Gameweek 36 neither manager got it right. For Lobo it has to be between the same three players as hit the high points totals in Gameweke 36. Liverpool Defender Alexander-Arnold, Liverpool midfielder Mi Salah or Manchester City forward Sergio Aguero. Although Manchester City's match at home to Leicester looks like a tough match with Liverpool's involvement in the Champions League Aguero is sure to play and looks like he wants to take City to the title. Of course, if Liverpool get hammered in the first leg in Barcelona both Salah and Alexander-Arbold come into play.

For Omid I think he has four options and not actually the players that hit the big scores in Gameweek 36, whilst I have mentioned that if anyone can score against Manchester City it is likely to be Vardy I think that would be a risky

selection. Callum Wilson also could have been picked for Gameweek 36 a home fixture to Tottenham would keep him in my thinking but surely Omid has to be attracted to his two Liverpool players Alexander-Arnold and Mane but then as mentioned for Lobo he will need to keep an eye on the Champions League Semi-Final first leg result. Then he has his two Manchester City players Raheem Sterling had a poor return in Gameweek 36 but has been involve din most of City's good play this season he must be considered. City defender LaPorte should also come under consideration although I have feeling Leicester will score so Omid would really need that clean sheet and maybe a goal or assist form Laporte who does get involved in corners. There is the potential curve ball for Omid if he was to bring in City's Leroy Sane or Bernado Silva. I would be very tempted to gamble on Silva, with City out of the Champions League focus is fully on retaining the title. Which for me means that Sterling or maybe Silva, remembering he is not even in Afzalalhom squad at the moment, Lobo has neither and I do not think he could really get Sterling in with his transfers although Bernado would be an option.

Well many questions for both managers to answer the manager that manages to find most of the solutions to those questions will be the one to come out on top.

THE VERDICT Anthony Lobo to come out on top with his use of the Bench Boost being the difference in this final. Looking at Lobo's team in Gameweke 36 I am very impressed with his selections and decisions. I can't quite figure out why he is struggling in Pyramid Two. Also, Lobo has in the Cups this season taken some big scalps and they don't come much bigger than Afzalalghom. That said going against Afzalalghom is a tough decision you can't argue with his record and I am very interested and worried with what he might do with those two transfers and captain pick. In the end though a close final to be decided by Lobo bench. **LOBO to win**.

HOW GOOD IS THAT VERDICT?

THE FC Expert has been back on form predicting the last two finals correctly. His current percentage for the FC Cup is 80% predicting 8 out of 10 finals correctly. So I would not take his / her match analysis lightly.
