Coming through to the final from the Qualifying Round which started against Adam Gill of the Conference in the Qualifying Round securing a 6-point victory. Next up was Pyramid Three manager Roger Wyatt, Bloomer eased through with 14-point victory. In the 2<sup>nd</sup> Round was Premier League manager Jonathan Strack in a tough encounter Bloomer securing for the second time in this cup run a 6-point victory. League Two Alfie Harris was next up once more a relatively easy victory was secured with a 10-point margin on this occasion, this victory equalled Bloomer's best ever cup run. Then it was an all-Conference clash against Kieran Hogwood with a Quarter-Final place up for grabs a tougher game but a score of 69 was enough to claim victory by 7 points saw Bloomer secure his best ever FC Cup run and put him into unknown territory. A Semi-Final place and prize money up for grabs Scott Smith of Pyramid Three stood in the way the coveted Semi-Final spot secured by 9 points. Another Premier League Manager stood in the way of a place in the final Andy Taylor, Bloomer running out a winner by 11 points to secure his first FC Cup final.

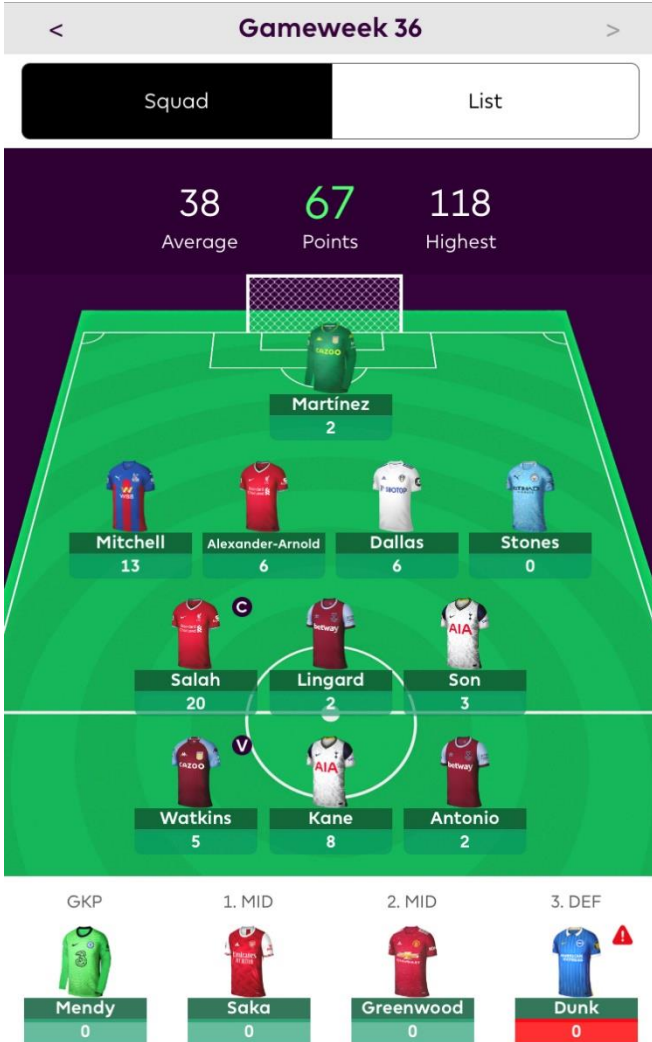
For the second season running Glen has managed to get to the final after failing to qualify for the First Round so he had to start in the Qualifying Round. Last Season he had one replay on his way to the final this time he didn't require any extra matches. In fact, in the main it looks like a relatively smooth path to the final his closest match coming in the Qualifying Round against fellow Premier League manager Sam Shew winning by just 2 points. Neil Williams of Pyramid One was dispatched with a 17-point winning margin his next victory was Steve Rogers winning by 20 points this time to overcome the Pyramid Two manager. Kin Chau was next up but the Conference manager did not mount a challenge with Glen winning by 51 points. Things were to get tighter from this point forward. In the 4<sup>th</sup> Round was another Pyramid Two manager in the form of Stephen Nicolaides who put a decent battle going down by just 6 points. Onto the Quarter-Finals and Mike Davies also of Pyramid Two was next and the margin of victory was even closer just 4 points this time, that victory creating FC Cup history as Glen progressed to his sixth semi-final. Dave Hansell of League Two was not going to deny Glen another appearance in a final as he won by 7 points.

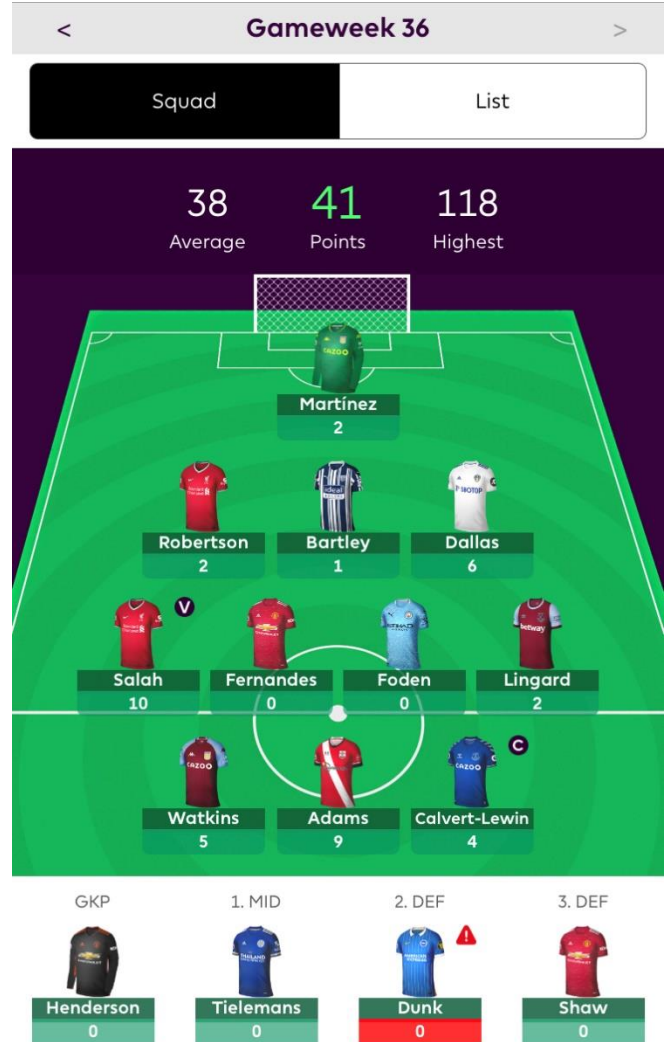

## FC Expert Match Analysis

### THE ANALYSIS

I started last season's preview with this sentence "Well very difficult this season as I have an hour to do the analysis". It is the same this season the only difference is that last season the gameweek was not finished as I started to look at the two teams. At least the above teams are the final scores. As we can see if the final had taken place in Gameweek 36 James Bloomer would have come out on top 63-41 a massive 22 point winning advantage, a quick glance tells you that Bloomer got his captain pick right a 13-point return from Crystal Palace defender Tyrick Mitchell making all the difference. Gameweek 36 was also difficult to judge due to the FA Cup final which meant various players didn't play both Hogwood and Bloomer having no point son their bench and ended with players in their starting elevens who didn't play.

As you will know with previous finals, I have delved into both teams and broken them down to do an in-depth analysis. Like last season however it is going to be difficult to do for this final with the time constraints. So, I am going to look at the components which are key in these matches looking at what chips the managers have left if any, what captain pick options they have and the finances and the amount and potential transfers options they have.

You could say that this played a vital part in Hogwood's victory last season he played Wolves Raul Jimenez as his triple captain who managed an assist to gain 15 points in total as a Triple Captain seeing as Hogwood won by a single point the contribution was highly significant. Last Season Hogwood was up against a manager who had a Free Hit this Season his opponent James Bloomer has no chips available to him. Surely Hogwood can take a big advantage here. However, if you look at the two scores from Gameweek 36 if Hogwood had of played his Triple Captain Calvert-Lewin he would still have lost by 14 points instead of 22. If Hogwood had got his captain pick right and selected Liverpool's Mo Salah it would have been an extra 18 points (Salah's extra 20 points minus Calvert-Lewins 2 extra points) which would not have been enough either but remember those special circumstances in Gameweek 36 Hogwood went into the gameweek knowing that only 10 of his starting eleven would play. So, add Salah's extra points, Hogwood would have been 4 points behind the extra player being a midfielder being a midfielder would reduce that deficit to 2 and potentially 1 with a clean sheet, then he would have just needed an assist or goal to have actually won the game. A lot of ifs and buts but you can see how a Triple Captain can put a completely different complexion on a game. There is no wavering in mind that this Triple Captain selection is going to be significant in this final. So what are Hogwood's options in Gameweek 36 Bloomer selected Salah he looks favourite again as Liverpool go away to Burnley, Liverpool needing victory to keep alive their Champions League qualification hopes and Burnley are playing on the back of a damaging four nil defeat to Leeds. Other options for Bloomer Mason Greenwood at home to Fulham or his Tottenham players who face a difficult home match against Aston Villa. Hogwood has two choices try and determine who Bloomer will play as Captain Neutralise that threat and gain an extra set of points or alternatively go all out on his own pick.

Neither manager got their captain picks correct although James Bloomer certainly got a better return and his captain was surpassed by one of the shock players of the gameweek Tyrick Mitchell (Crystal Palace), whilst Hogwood got it horribly wrong in Gameweek 36 with the selection of Calvert-Lewin, Hogwood had four other players who all out scored Calvert-Lewin. When it comes to the final Bloomer has many good options, he has Salah again and Liverpool team mate Trent Alexander-Arnold away to Burnley chasing that Champions League spot, he has Manchester Uniteds Mason Greenwood at home to Fulham, United though have that Europa League final coming up will Solskjaer rest players or want to get one more win on the board to confirm second place. Then he has to West Ham Players Antonio and Lingaard away to already relegated West Bromwich Albion. Hogwood could cover Salah and Lingaard or go with a risky Che Adams punt as the Southampton forward sees the Saints host Leeds in a game which you feel could be an end of season goal fest. All that said logically Salah looks to be the sensible pick for both managers Bloomer sensing that Salah's recent return to form will see good points return and hope that Hogwood covers this with his Triple Captain and the rest of his other good options come up trumps to make the difference. Hogwood looking to cover the Bloomer move and ensure he gets the top scorer and hope that Liverpool cruise to a victory in a revenge victory making up for that defeat to Burnley Anfield early in the season, with Salah getting big score to really make a difference with those triple captain points.

So interesting to see these two managers use their transfers in gameweek 36 as both have other fronts to battle on. Hogwood is embroiled in a relegation battle in the Premier league 4 points from safety and was involved in the New Life Cup Semi-Final losing out on aggregate. Bloomer won in the Conference to keep alive his promotion chance she is 5 points off promotion with two to play but like Hogwood he was also involved in a cup semi-final making the Champions League final. Both managers will want to win this final but will not be going all in on the transfer front as in losing points unless the feel they are happy to sacrifice this match for a greater good but both have to think about those vital league games. As you can see both managers have good bank balances but can only see them making one transfer each.

### THE CHIP EFFECT

CHIP	EXPLANATION
Wildcard	The Wildcard chip can be used twice a season, once in the first half of the season and once in the second half of the season. The Wildcard chip is played when confirming transfers that cost points and can't be cancelled once played.
Bench Boost	All the Players on your Substitute Bench score points for that gameweek
Free Hit	You can make unlimited transfers in the gameweek you play your free hit. When the gameweek finishes your team will revert to how it was setup the previous gameweek. You will lose any saved transfers so will only have 1 free transfer after a free hit has been played.
Triple Captain	Instead of the normal double points your Captains Points are tripled
<b>OTHER INFORMATION</b>	<b>Can I Play More than One Chip in a Gameweek</b> Only one chip may be active in a Gameweek. For example, it is not possible to make transfers with your Wildcard chip and then use your Bench Boost chip in the same Gameweek <b>The following chips can only be played once per season</b> Bench Boost, Free Hit and triple Captain <b>What happens to my Triple Captain chip if my captain doesn't play</b> The triple point's bonus will be passed to your vice-captain. ## In the Event of A Draw

The FC Cup is the only Major cup competition in which if the final is drawn the match will go to a replay. The replay will be held in Gameweek 38. If the replayed final ends in a draw the match will go into a penalty Shoot-Out. A penalty shoot-means each team's top five-point scorers will go head to head to produce a result. If the best five scorers' in the two teams cannot produce a result sudden death will take place with the next highest point scorers being next.

## FC Expert Match Analysis

### THE VERDICT

Each season I get to this point and try to refrain from talking about options but in the end, any match especially for Fantasy games it is all about the options in front of the two managers. The biggest option available to these two managers is the single chip that is on offer to Glen Hogwood, now this Triple Captain Chip is asking Hogwood two questions, do you want to neutralise what seems to be his opponents best captain option or do you go with what represents the most points on offer to him, of course the answer could be the same. When you look at the two current squads it does appear that Bloomer has more scoring opportunities but a lot of the major hitters are offset by Hogwood, for example Bloomer has Liverpool's Trent Alexander-Arnold Hogwood as Liverpool's other full back Andy Robertson in recent weeks you would say that Alexander-Arnold is scoring more points through assists but Robertson will negate any clean sheets. These head-to-head battles are seen throughout the two squads, in my opinion whilst Hogwood wins a couple of these battles Bloomer comes out on top. Even after taking this into account, you circle back to that Triple Captain and the question is will Hogwood get that selection right and make it the difference in this match.

**FINAL VERDICT** Last season I knew it was going to be a close final I was an awe of the two managers both with successful histories big hitters in the FC World and both had Chips on offer. This season Glen Hogwood is back and has already made history but is looking to make more. His opponent has one major final under his belt and this season he has made two finals. Bloomer has to pick his best eleven and get his one transfer right I back him to do this Hogwood has to do the same and then get that Triple Captain selection right. It would be a brave pundit to go against Hogwood on that and in this competition so not sur eit will as close or go down to the wire of the final bonus points like it did last season but this is going to be another close affair but I can't escape that Triple Captain pick. **HOGWOOD to win.**

### HOW GOOD IS THAT VERDICT?

THE FC Expert like todays two finalists is feeling the pressure as he has failed to predict the correct winner of the last two finals. However last season he did predict a close encounter selected wrong but the final was decided by just a single point with the FC Expert predicting that the managers would be within 4 points of each other.
