Welcome to this season's FC Cup Final preview.

Can you believe today's final is the first in a third decade of this competition the oldest Fantasy Challenge special competition, yes, the FC Cup is the longest running of all the special competitions that Fantasy Challenge run only the normal basic games of the FC League has been running longer and that has only been running for an extra season.

We often refer to the FC Cup as being the most difficult to win as its single match knock out system to certain extent has an element of luck get one decision wrong and it can see you knocked out with the rich history pointing to this fact. The FC Cup has seen just three multiple winners and six managers making more than one appearance in the final. The two managers facing off with a chance to win this prestigious trophy are in fact both debutants in a FC Cup final which makes this the third consecutive final where the contestants will be debutants.

Interestingly both of today's finalists are also applying their trade in the Pyramid super20 league structure. Both having very different seasons in their respective leagues. John Bellamy is in his third season of FC with a couple of Lucky Promotions to his name he had not really been a name mentioned in the dispatches of the FC World until last season when he won the Pyramid Cup and now a season later Bellamy is hoping to add a second major trophy. Just getting to this final has gained him notoriety within the FC World, amazing that his Pyramid Premier campaign has been an average one lying in 11th place with two games to go. Many are watching how Bellamy gets on in this final as he has started to gain a reputation as being a Cup manager.

Bellamy's Opponent in today's final is Vinay Desai is in only his second season of FC. Desai's rookie season did not set off any signals of him being a potential major trophy winner, claiming a Lucky Promotion and in fact being knocked out at the First-Round stage of the FC Cup last season. Desai though has come back stronger in his second season. Desai is currently sitting in 2nd place in the Pyramid Two league table and is 6 points clear of 6th place just a single point away from claiming promotion to Pyramid One. Can Desai make his second season one to remember with a double of promotion and the FC Cup trophy, all eyes of the FC World are on him to see if he can.

You may have noticed this season that I have been helped by Mike Carleton, assisting with the gameweek updates I would like to take this opportunity to express my gratitude and thanks, whilst it might not have been noticed by you the managers in the game this has been a massive help in getting the update in a timely fashion.

Another first for the FC Game is happening in this preview there will not just be the FC Expert casting his eye over the two respective managers' teams and the potential outcome of this final I have asked AI yes Microsoft Copilot to give an opinion on today's final.

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FC Expert Match Analysis

THE ANALYSIS

Finally, a Final where I have more than one day to assess the two respective managers teams. Which I might need as FC founder Paul Richardson has told me that he has also asked AI Microsoft's Co-Pilot to also asses todays finalist.

Suddenly even more pressure to get the prediction correct.

If the final had taken place in Gameweek 36 Vinay Desai would have come out the winner by 6 points in a close high scoring final. Let's hope both managers can put on a similar showing in this final.

As in previous seasons I am ging to break down what I feel will be the key areas that will decide this final.

In recent seasons the Chip affect has been absolutely massive often one manager having a chip to play. Todays final both managers have a chip left and amazingly it is the same Chip Bench Boost. Surely both managers are going to deploy this chip to try and win this trophy. If we look at Gameweek 36 if Bellamy had played the chip, he would have gained an extra 6 points drawing him level however Desai would have scored an extra 7 points so increasing his winning margin. Interestingly both managers had two non-scoring substitutes. Desai has Newcastle's Fabian Schar on his bench out injured until 1st June so he will be thinking of replacing him with a transfer. **CONCLUSION:** - neither manager has a clear advantage hear as both have the chip it is just going to be about who can get the maximum out of their bench.

You cannot doubt that both managers got their captain picks spot on for Gameweek 36. It is interesting to note though that only Desai had another player who he could have selected but even then, Chelsea's Jackson would have been 10 points off City's Haaland. With Haaland having another double gameweek surely neither manager is going to deviate from the Norwegian goal scoring machine. Although Tottenham, Brighton, Chelsea, Manchester United and Newcastle all have two fixtures and although City are facing two away fixtures at Fulham then Tottenham with then needing wins to claim the title it would be a brave manager to go against a Haaland pick. Both have Foden of City and of course transfer will either of them see this as the possible differential. **CONCLUSION:** - Both managers to pick Haaland as captain, if one is brave enough to go different it will be the deciding factor in this final so I just can't see either risking it as percentages say it will end in defeat.

Both managers saved their transfers in Gameweek 36 which suggests to me they both have their eyes firmly fixed on this final. Both have good budgets over the £100 Million however it is interesting to see that Bellamy has significantly more money in the bank £3.6 Million to be precise. This does give him the upper hand when it comes to transfers with both managers looking to find players who have double fixtures for this final. **CONCLUSION:** - Bellamy has the advantage here with a significant transfer budget to get more players into his squad with two fixtures to play. I feel that I can predict two transfers one each for both managers. Desai will have to sell Schar and I can see Bellamy bringing in Ederson for Neto.

We have already established that this final is not going to be 11 V 11 but 15 V 15 it is interesting to see that there are currently 6 players different in these two Fifteens. If we first look at Bellamy's Differentials his reserve goalkeeper Neto is not playing so he might need to do a transfer here, Pau Torres has only one fixture a tough one against Liverpool, Reguilon also just the one fixture Gusto his last defender has two fixtures. Garnacho has two home fixtures but difficult opponents and then Isak upfront has two fixtures and I see him as being the biggest differential here. For Desai keeper Ederson two fixtures looks good albeit away fixtures we all know how important those games are for City. Dan Burn of Newcastle two fixtures chasing Europe, Saliba of Arsenal you are wondering if an away trip to Old Trafford is tough these days but that is his only fixture, then the injured Fabian Schar surely Desai has to transfer him out. Maddison in midfield faces Burnley and City at home surely there are points for the taking against Burnley and anything in the City game could be a bonus. Then upfront Jackson two away fixtures Nottingham Forest and Brighton with Chelsea's recent form both winnable. **CONCLUSION:** - I am really seeing this as Bellamy with a slight advantage mainly down to Isak upfront but Desai might feel that Jackson can counter that and he does have Ederson also. That said Bellamy to transfer Neto out and Isak to be the differential.

At first glance it looks like advantage Desai as he has an extra player playing 2 matches but that extra player is out injured so Desai will have to transfer Schar out and bring in a player with two fixtures to maintain that advantage but having used one of his transfers it means that Desai can only bring in one other player with two matches to play with his remaining transfer. We would then assume that Bellamy is going to make his two transfers and bring in players with two matches so after all of that both managers will end up with 13 out of their 15 players playing two matches.

CONCLUSION: - No advantage in fact this will come down to how well the two managers play their transfers. I feel that I can predict Bellamy's transfer I see him bringing in Ederson for Neto not sure what Desai is going to do with his budget and the sale of Schar. As I look at the above differentials this match is between Bellamy's Isak and Desai's Jackson.

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FC Expert Match Analysis

THE VERDICT

Well once you dive into the two managers squads it never is as simple as it may first appear. Having done a deep dive into both squads the main points of this match are contained in that Bench Boost chip that they both have the transfers and the players they have playing two matches. A final which will see 15 V 15 match is always intriguing and this is up there with the best that I have looked at in the past. The chip negates as both managers have it, the double matches are virtually negated by the fact the managers have the same in fact in the five categories where I have decided to look into three have been inconclusive the remaining two both went to Bellamy. I gave the differential to Bellemy but only slightly looking Desai's selection of Chelsea's fixtures Jackson could cancel out what I see as being the Isak factor for Bellamy. Then the only real conclusion was that Bellamy has the greater transfer budget with both manager shaving two transfers I also feel lone transfer is forced on both managers Bellamy surely has to sell Neto and bring in Ederson cancelling out Desai's selection of the City keeper, whilst Desai must transfer out Schar and with a healthy budget can probably bring in any defender he wants however I am not predicting two clean sheets for any of the clubs playing two matches. Just 6 points separated these two managers in Gameweek 36 and I predict an even closer finish for this final.

FINAL VERDICT Another season where I am really struggling to separate these two managers, crazy but the more I look at the two squads I this final is going to come down to the scores of two players Bellamy's Isak and Desai's Jackson. The Fantasy Premier league difficulty rating suggests that Chelsea have the better games I do agree but whilst Jackson has come good recently, I will be backing Isak the season long performer to come up trumps in this final and be the deciding differential factor. It is going to be a close final and I hope that both managers can break the hundred-point barrier and deliver a classic final. **Bellamy to win.**
