POGBA MAKES GREDLEY A HISTORY MAKER

Ian Gredley's captain Paul Pogba hit an amazing 36 points helping Gredley to victory and become the first ever manager to retain the Super20 Cup. A close final came down to the final match of the gameweek with both managers having their captains to play. Reigning Premier League Champions Lee Ferridge played his wildcard for the final and made 7 changes to his squad. Ian Gredley used his two free transfers one of which proved to be decisive bringing in Manchester United's Paul Pogba for

Liverpool's Saido Mane. After the first fixture of the gameweek Gredley held a single point advantage. After Saturday's 3pm matches the lead was 8 points. Then in the last fixture on Saturday Lee Ferridge saw Mo Salah hit 12 points helping to put him into the lead in the final by 6 points. With 4 fixtures to be played on Sunday both managers had 5 players to play. The first fixture saw Gredley see David Luiz & Eden Hazard of Chelsea and Crystal Palace defender Wan-Bissaka take the field. They added 17 points Luiz hitting 12. Gredley now led by 11 points with two players remaining in the last fixture both of Manchester United Anthony Martial and captain Paul Pogba. Before the final fixture Ferridge would see West Ham's Lukasz Fabianski and Raheem Sterling of Manchester City play. He also had Southampton's Danny Ings but Ings would not play. Sterling and Fabianski added 8 points to Ferridge's total leaving him trailing by just 3 points. The last fixture of the final would see Ferridge pit his Manchester United duo Jesse Lingard and captain Marcus Rashford alongside David Brooks (Bournemouth) coming off the bench for Ings. In the 5th minute some amazing skill from Rashford saw him gain an assist unfortunately for Ferridge he assisted Pogba. That saw Gredley move back to a 6 point advantage then in 33rd minute Pogba scored again increasing the lead to 16 points. On the 45th minute a lifeline for Ferridge as Rashford scored but the assist came from Martial. Just two minutes later David Brooks assisted for Ferridge and Bournemouth reducing the deficit to 8 points. Then in the 72nd Minute Paul Pogba gained an assist taking the lead back to 14 points. No more assists or goals were recorded. Rashford got 2 bonus points and Pogba got 3 with the added appearance points Ian Gredley had won the final by 15 points.
