#### INTRODUCTION

The New Life Cup which was the brainchild of former manager Thomas Lusty in the pub as he joked one evening that FC should organise a competition for the losing managers of the group stage of the Champions League is entering it second decade.

Taking the principles of the real UEFA Champions League competition where third placed teams dropped into the UEFA Europa League competition the idea which was first muted by Tom Lusty became a real vision in 2014 with the idea of giving II those managers that finished third in their Champions League or Pyramid Cup groups get a chance for glory and chance to sample a knockout tournament over two legs.

The name of the competition might seem to be fairly easy but it was in fact the name of the Sunday League football team which Fantasy Challenge sponsored, New Life United FC it just felt like a dram name for the newest competition in the FC World. So the New Life Cup was born, although the trophy is of course a shield of the New Life United FC Logo / badge.

After Six consecutive seasons where we saw managers from both of the feeding competitions take part in the final last season saw the first ever all Pyramid Cup final, meaning both managers came form that competition, this was a breakthrough for the Pyramid Cup as the New Life Cup had been dominated by managers form the Champions League well the 2024 season has seen that service renewed as both managers qualified form the Champions League.

There is another break from last season's final which saw two rookie managers fight it out for the coveted prize today's final we will have two absolute stalwarts of the FC World. FC Legend Steve Shew a manager with five, yes five, major trophies to his name, also becoming just the third manager in the history of this competition to make a second final. His opponent Michael Lynn is still searching for his first major trophy but with four promotions to his name and appearing in three previous major trophy finals.

Steve Shew's incredible history in the game has seen his player profile go over two pages a first for any Player Profile in any major final. 'Shewy' as he is known throughout the FC World is a major player in the history of the game plying his trade since season 2005 as mention he is multiple major trophy winner with those five major trophies wins, he currently sits alongside Adam 'Adski' Pemberton and James Dwinfour as the most successful mangers in the entire history of the Fantasy Challenge game. If 'Shewy' can claim the New Life Cup for the first time in his career he will become the most successful manger in the history of the game.

Michael Lynn 'Shewy's' opponent in this final, would ordinarily be the manager that would take up most of the focus and would be being spoken about as the favourite and big FC World star. Lynn is stills searching for that elusive first major trophy. Lynn has suffered defeats in the 2009 Pyramid Cup final, 2014 Champions League Final and a season later the 2015 FC Cup Final. That first final Lynn came within two points of victory losing out narrowly to work colleague James O'Leary. In recent season Lynn has fallen down the super20 leagues the question is can he get over the line and stop 'Shewy' from making history and gain his first major trophy to go alongside his three promotions and super20 Conference title.

As mentioned, this competition was named after the Sunday Football team that Fantasy Challenge have sponsored New Life United. Fantasy Challenge founder Paul Richardson is club chairman of New Life United. Once more this season we will give an update on the progress of New Life United FC as the end of this review

Before I sign off, I want to apologise for any spelling and or grammatical mistakes in this preview the timeframes are just getting tighter every season the alternative is no preview. I would also like to express my thanks to Mike Carleton for his hard work and assistance in updating the game this season.

#### THE ANALYSIS

Well can you believe it I have got an extra day as finally we have a season where Gameweek 37 finished on Wednesday night allowing Fantasy Challenge founder Paul Richardson to give me the two cup finalists teams on a Thursday.

Although I have the extra time, I feel I have hit upon a formula that works, at the time of writing II can confirm that I predicting the 2024 FC Cup final correctly even after being put under extra pressure from Paul asking AI Microsoft CoPilot to also do an analysis and prediction, so once more you will see below me go through the key components as I see them in this final.

Before I even look at the two managers teams in gameweek 37 I am already intrigued an interested in the cup final I am aware of both of these managers history in the game as they have both featured in several finals over the seasons and not sure if many of you know this but I have been informed that they are both Chelsea fans so the New Life Cup Final of 2024 could almost be nicknamed the battle of Stamford Bridge.

Looking at the two sides in gameweek 37 Steve 'Shewy' Shew would have run out a 9-point winner over Michael Lynn. If you look at the stats of the two teams in gameweek 37 you will see that the difference was in Midfield where Shewy's amassed 10 more points than Lynn. Both having Tottenham's Son and Chelsea's Palmer (No surprise there from these two managers!!!) It came down to Shey having Newcastle's Gordon and Manchester City's Foden both scoring higher than Lynn's Brennan Johnson of Tottenham and Arsenal's Bukayo Saka.

There is no doubt that this is a clash between two titans of the FC World it is going to be interesting to see how the analysis pans out for this final

Unbelievable I have just finished doing my analysis of the Pyramid Cup final in which both managers had exactly the same the same chips available. I apologies for those of you who have read all the previews but this analysis is not going to be much different o the Pyramid Cup Final. With both managers having chips available there is no doubt in my mind that this is going to be where this final is won and lost. As I have mentioned in the Pyramid Cup Final Preview, I see the Bench Boost as being the better option of the two Chips especially as I am sure both will pick Haaland as captain. In Gameweek 37 if Shewy had played that bench boost he would have added 21 points to his total whilst Lynn's Triple Cpatain would only have added 15 widening the winning margin for Shewy by another 6 points. Does a Bench Boost trump a Triple Captain, well the Bench Boost gives a manager an extra Four players to score points, whilst Triple Captain only really represents one extra player. **CONCLUSION:** - Shewy's Bench Boost has the advantage here.

Both managers got their captain pick correct and with City going for the title I can't see either of them gambling on not picking Haaland again especially as the Norwegian superstar has a home fixture against West Ham with the title to be won and West Ham virtually on the beach. Question can Lynn really gamble against Haaland Shewy will be hoping not and will select Haaland to try and negate that Triple Captain score by as much as possible. For Lynn with his current squad surely, the only other option is Chelsea's Palmer which would be a massive gamble. **CONCLUSION:** - No advantage here. Can Lynn really afford to gamble.

Shewy played a transfer in Gameweek 37 so has one less transfer and has two players who are 75% chance of playing with that Bench Boost can he gamble on them or will he be forced to transfer one of them. Initially seeing Goalkeeper Ederson of Manchester City as only having a 75% chance you think he must do this transfer but his sub goalkeeper is the same as Lynn's Chelsea's Petrovic so on second thought sit is the injured Gordon of Newcastle where I think he will concentrate his single transfer. With the sale of Gordon and a war chest of £2 Million I see Shewy having £8.5 Million I just can't see past Arsenal's Havertz the former Chelsea player who won the Blues the Champions League a few seasons ago will Shewy ask Havertz to bring home the New Life Cup for him. Lynn has two transfers but does not have the transfer budget that Shewy has. However, I think it is in midfield where Lynn will be concentrating his efforts Arsenal's Bukayo Saka showing as a 75% Chance of playing will Lynn wait to hear the latest fitness news on the Arsenal player or Like Shewy potentially swap him out for fellow team mate Havertz or maybe OdeGaard. The question is can he do that or will he be tempted to to bring in Manchester City's Foden who Shewy has to try and neutralise him although there would not be enough in the Budget for both Havertz and Foden. Is there value somewhere else in the market. **CONCLUSION:** - No advantage here for either manager. Yes, Lynn has that extra transfer but I don't think he has the funds to really make it work whilst Shewy has the finds to make his one transfer count.

I have to say I am quite shocked to see eight differentials in the two squads however it does make it very interesting. As mentioned, I feel the advantage lies With Shewy's Bench Boost meaning all of his differentials will play his full squad. As mentioned in the transfer section two of Shewy's players have only a 75% chance of playing both are differentials, goalkeeper Ederson we do not think represents a problem worth leaving him as if he is fit and plays it will be a bonus but as Shewys second choice keeper is the same as Lynn's this is already negated. Looking at his other differentials I see two problems the other injured player Gordon in midfield and Everton's Branthwaite in defence. Everton have secured their premiership place and are away to title chasing Arsenal, I see Arenal running out easy winners here having a good start with the pressure of thinking City will win. Does Shewy gamble on Gordons fitness and make a change in defence. As for his other differentials all look like good potential point scorers. When we look at Lynn's differentials, he really only has four and one of those is a potential injury. Saliba in defence looks good and I like the look of Johnson in midfield Tottenham away to Sheffield Unite don the final day I can Spurs grabbing a few goals to secure a European place. But the Saka is injured and Watkins who has been a revelation upfront this season I wonder about Villa's motivation on the final day when a Champions Leaue place has been secured will they be up for it at Palace. **CONCLUSION**: -Slight advantage to Shewy here. The Bench Boost means all his differentials play if Ederson does play that I think is going to make a big difference the it is just the Branthwaite Gordon conundrum For Lynn he has four good options but that Saka injury and the Villa Conundrum are his major concerns.

#### THE VERDICT

I am looking forward to this final as although I see a potential clear winner because of the Chip factor both of these managers are great Matchplay strategists in fact we are going to witness a final between two of the best of match players in the entire history of the FC World.

After looking at all the analysis the final for me comes down to two factors Shewy's Bench Boost and Lynn's extra transfer. Can Lynn really pull off a masterstroke and find a way to combat that Bench Boost.

I can't help but fill thi sis another final which will be all about the Chip factor, could Lynn shock us all a triple Captain someone other than Haaland and negate that Bench Boost.

#### **FINAL VERDICT: -**

Steve 'Shewy' Shew to win and become the most successful FC Manager in the history of the game.

I just can't see Lynn coming up with an answer for that Bench boost. However, Michael Lynn is one of the few managers in the game that could potentially find that answer.

#### IN THE EVENT OF A DRAW

In the event of a draw the match will go into a penalty Shoot-Out. A penalty shoot-out will take place, each team's top five-point scorers will go head-to-head to produce a result. # NEW LIFE UNITED FC SEASON REVIEW



Recent years has seen turbulent times for New Life United FC in fact the club folded but like a phoenix from the flames it rose from the ashes the reformation though was not the smoothest and at times it looked once more that the club would no longer survive. Trying to establish itself back in WESFA's (Woolwich and Eltham Sunday Alliance) lowest division. At the end of season 2021-22 WESFA restructured their league pyramid and took the decision to not renew New Life United. At that moment the future was uncertain but with the board doubtful that this club could continue Manager Nick Balancy (FC Manager in Pyramid Two) once more showed the drive and determination to keep the club alive. Insisting that he had a team to turn things around. The club affiliated with the Metropolitan Sunday Football League. Joining the bottom division. Last season 2022-2023 things did not start well with the team losing 7 of their opening 10 fixtures to sit bottom of the table. An amazing second half of the season saw the club finish 7<sup>th</sup> out of 11. With season 2023-2024 approaching spirits were high within the club but once more there would be turmoil as another breakaway team was formed. This left a depleted squad and once more New Life United FC almost starting from scratch. The season started with six straight defeats leaving New Life United bottom of the table. Again, the manager and the team turned it around after that sixth defeat the team went on a 5-match unbeaten run, winning 4, unfortunately a win and draw would be removed due to a team dropping out of the league. New Life United have completed their season but the table got very complicated as two teams dropped out the adjusted table actually saw New Life drop down as they lost 4 points where other teams didn't lose points as they had lost to the teams dropping out. Orpington had in fact won 2 games Whilst Three Little Birds had won 3 and drawn 2. Several clubs benefiting from them dropping out whilst New Life lost 4 points.
