

This final though is very difficult to do a full analysis as when we look at Sanj Joshi's team he has a free hit for this final so you do not need to be an expert this final is going to come down to how well he plays that Free Hit.

These two managers were in the same group in this competition as and as you can see from the results above Jonas came out on top in both fixtures and as we know had the final taken place in Gameweek 37 Silva would have come out on top again 66-57 even after Joshi had played a bench boost.

Jonas will obviously be trying t get as many points as possible in this cup final but will now b aware of that free hit, which surely means Silva cannot afford to do more than the 1 transfer he has available to him as he can't afford to give away points. He has two Manchester United players in Greenwood and Fernandes a big question will they play with that Europa League final coming up on Wednesday then a further difficulty for Silva is that one of his forwards Southampton's Che Adams is now out injured. Does Silva with the knowledge of that free hit make his transfer for Che Adams and go left field with a forward and make him captain but what are those possible options. Could Burnley go goal crazy at Bramall Lane and risk a Chris Wood or Matej Vydra, could Everton gain a shock final day victory against Manchester City Reserves so would Calvert-Lewin be a possibility. A massive gamble could be Fabio Silva of Wolves playing against a potential reserve Manchester United team bag some goals this does seem to biggest long shot of those potential captain picks. One other left field selection could be Arsenal's Pierre Patrick-Aubameyang at home to Brighton bringing him in for Fernandes (Manchester United).

I feel that Silva is forced to make what appears at first look a shock transfer and captain decision.

For Joshi that free hit gives him the option to neutralise Silva's team surely, he will cover the big hitters so I think he will match Silva's back three Alexander-Arnold and Robertson both Liverpool and Leeds Dallas. In Midfield cover Lingaard (West Ham), Salah (Liverpool) and Raphinha (Leeds) then match Antonio (West Ham) and Bamford (Leeds) leaving him 3 transfers making a goalkeeper, Single midfielders and Forward big choices but surely giving Joshi the advantage.

In the event of a draw the match will go into a penalty Shoot-Out. Each team's top five point scorers will go head to head to produce a result. If the best five scorer's in the two teams cannot produce a result sudden death will take place with the next highest point scorers being next.
